5th edition of the CITIES AND ROOFS OF CAMEROON EXHIBITION

<u>Theme</u>: « The contribution of working-class neighbourhoods to sustainable development for all ».

Date: October 25, 2023

Location: Japoma Sports Complex Douala - Cameroon

Languages: English and French.

CONTEXT

Uncoordinated urbanisation risks becoming the second major global crisis after climate change. Yet well-designed and controlled urbanisation is a tremendous tool for implementing sustainable development, in both developing and developed countries. Sustainable development is the idea that human societies should live and meet their needs without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs. This is why the contribution and participation of all stakeholders, including governments, elected representatives, experts, private companies, civil society organisations, the media and citizens, are more necessary than ever. UN-Habitat, the United Nations programme working for a better urban future, calls for this every day, because our cities are facing unprecedented demographic, environmental, economic, social and spatial challenges. The effects, such as the lack of decent housing and the growth of working-class neighbourhoods, unsuitable or obsolete infrastructure, unemployment, poverty, insecurity, crime, pollution and poor health, are increasingly perceptible.

The 5th edition of the Salon Villes et Toits du Cameroun Cities and Roofs of Cameroon Exhibition (CRCE), a forum for promoting working-class neighbourhoods, is now a meeting place for giving and receiving, bringing together all those involved in urban issues, the residents of working-class neighbourhoods, corporate citizens, the media, local elected representatives and the administration. Held in conjunction with the celebration of World Cities Day, instituted by UN-Habitat, the 5th CRCE will address the issue of the *contribution and participation of all in sustainable urban development*, hence the theme "*The contribution of working-class neighbourhoods to sustainable development for all*". This contribution or participation will be addressed at three levels, notably in terms of mobilising financial resources for sustainable development programmes and projects in working-class neighbourhoods, in terms of planning and finally in terms of environmental protection. The contribution of working-class neighbourhoods refers not only to the contribution and participation of players living in working-class neighbourhoods, but to that of everyone, namely: Government, local elected representatives, corporate citizens, experts on urban issues, researchers/academics, the media and residents of working-class neighbourhoods.















- Axe 3: environment and circular economy.

To this end, the CRCE Technical Organising Committee is calling on all those interested in this annual forum for reflection to make their contributions in a variety of forms (articles, artistic productions, etc.) in French or English on the following themes:

1. DEVELOPMENT OF BASIC SOCIAL INFRASTRUCTURES

- Participatory development dynamics in working-class neighbourhoods: interactions between the entrepreneurship of working-class neighbourhood residents and the intervention of external players (SDE, CTD, other organisations, etc.).
- Inclusive projects: contributions from working-class neighbourhoods.

2. ENVIRONMENT AND CIRCULAR ECONOMY

- Working-class neighbourhoods put to the test of environmental challenges and the circular economy to improve their living environment.
- Sustainable development and quality of life in working-class neighbourhoods.

3. MOBILISING FINANCIAL RESOURCES

- How to support socio-economic and cultural initiatives for working-class neighbourhoods?
- Seeking sources of funding for a better neighbourhood.

All applications will receive an acknowledgement of receipt within 48 hours of submission and a registration number on Thursday 28 September 2023, with an email from the Technical Organising Committee indicating the outcome of their submission.
